are not eligible

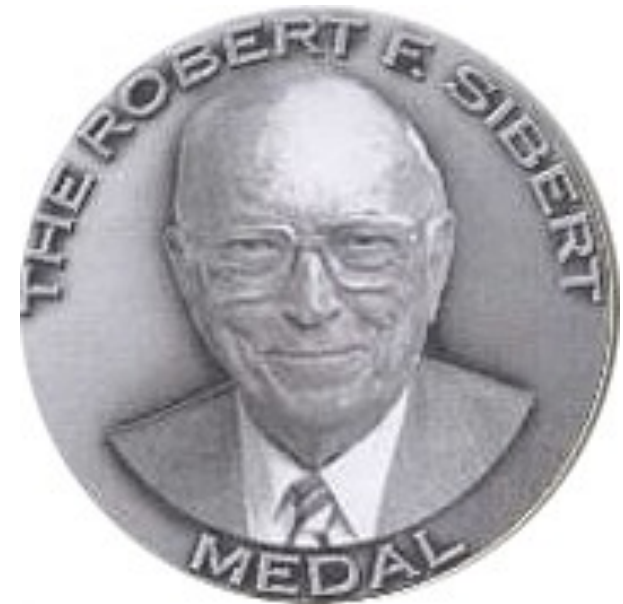
